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Hitachi Submits Amendment Statement for Tender Offer Registration Statement Relating to Hitachi Medical Shares

Tokyo, December 3, 2013 --- Hitachi, Ltd. (TSE:6501 "Hitachi") today announced that it has submitted to the Kanto Local Finance Bureau an Amendment Statement for Tender Offer Registration Statement in relation to the announcement of its intention to purchase common stocks of Hitachi Medical Corporation (TSE:6910 "Hitachi Medical") by way of a public tender offer (the "Tender Offer") as of November 13, 2013. The Amendment Statement was submitted to the Kanto Local Finance Bureau pursuant to the provisions of Article 27-8, Paragraph 1 of the Financial Instruments and Exchange Act of Japan. Summary of the Amendment Statement is as follows.

Summary of the Amendment Statement

Hitachi has submitted the Amendment Statement because Hitachi has made certain amendments to the information contained in the Tender Offer Registration Statement submitted on November 14, 2013 and also needs to disclose certain additional information. Summary of the amendments is as follows:

- Amendment of information shown and disclosure of additional information after identifying new special related parties who had held shares of Hitachi Medical as of November 14, 2013
- Note: All of the newly identified special related parties are small-scale shareholders (persons excluded from special related parties in accordance with Article 3, Paragraph 2, Item 1 of the Cabinet Office Ordinance with respect to Disclosure of a Tender Offer for Shares by an Offeror other than Issuer in the calculation of ownership ratio of shares under each item in the provisions of Article 27-2, Paragraph 1 of the Financial Instruments and Exchange Act of Japan.)
